

EXPLANATION OF GPA CALCULATION



GPA REQUIREMENT

Applicants must have a 3.25 on the last 60 credit hours of all college-level coursework attempted (or a 3.25 overall if they have attempted between 15 and 59 hours) and a 2.5 UH GPA.



GPA CALCULATION

- All courses attempted for college-level credit are used regardless of where they are taken, including repeated courses and coursework that does not count towards a BBA degree.
- The calculation includes all transfer work within the last 60 credit hours, including courses that did not transfer because of a low grade.
- Only letter grades with an assigned grade point value are used, see chart below.
- The calculation begins with the most recent semester and goes back from there, until you reach 60 hours.
- If the 60th semester hour occurs in the middle of a given semester, all grades for that semester are used to determine GPA.



TARGET GPA CALCULATION

To do a target GPA, use the original calculation and add any new credit hours with grades. You must take out from the bottom row of the calculation if necessary because only the last (most recent) 60 hours are used to determine admission. See example below.

SCENARIO FOR TARGET:

John has a 2.90 GPA on the last 63 hours. He is taking 12 hours in summer 2022 at HCC and wants to know how that will affect his GPA.
